- P** Guide us throughout this Lenten season as we climb deeper into your embrace.
- C** **And let us put to death those things that separate us from each other and from you.**
- P** May we know your presence is always with us.
- C** **May we know the power of your transforming love within us.**
- P** May we know your grace surrounds us and is beyond us.
- C** **In the name of Jesus, our faithful friend and companion on this journey. Amen.**

## Confession and Forgiveness

- P** Gracious and merciful God, we confess to you our reluctance to enter those moments when we are confronted with our true selves.
- C** **Reveal our true nature, O God, and increase our trust in you.**
- P** When we are tempted to put worldly values before our desire for you, and when our hunger for more is greater than our hunger for seeking and doing your will:
- C** **Forgive us, O God, and increase our trust in you.**
- P** When we are tempted to use the gifts you give us to benefit ourselves at the expense of serving others:
- C** **Forgive us, O God, and increase our trust in you.**
- P** When we are tempted to seek our glory, rather than being guided by the humility of Christ:
- C** **Forgive us, O God, and increase our trust in you.**

*Silence for reflection on God's Word and self-examination*

- P** Merciful Father,

**☩ Save us from times of trial and deliver us from evil. Forgive all our sins and fill us with the joy and peace of your salvation. Strengthen us with your Spirit that we may confidently put our whole trust in you, just as Jesus did. This we pray in his name. Amen.**

**☩** The Apostle John writes in 1 John 1:8-9, *"If we say we have no sin, we deceive ourselves, and the truth is not in us. If we confess our sins, he is faithful and just to forgive us our sins and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness."* As you have confessed, so also is God faithful and just. Because of Christ's work on the cross, your sins are forgiven ☩ and you are cleansed from all your unrighteousness.

## **An Invitation to Engage During Lent**

**☩** Lent is not a season designed for us to be miserable, but for taking stock and resetting our aims for following Christ.

**☩ Loving God, in you we trust, let us never fool ourselves.**

**☩** Lent is an opportunity for healthy repentance – repentance for our indifference in the face of the permeating evil of the world, – and repentance for our personal sins which we have glossed over as "mere foibles."

**☩ According to your loving kindness, remember us, God of goodness and saving grace.**

**☩** Lent is truly a time for joy as we experience the exhilaration that comes from defying temptations, from turning our face to the light that shines on the narrow path of Christ, from walking into adverse winds, and from enjoying small victories day by day.

**☩ Make us to know your ways, O God, teach us your paths, for you are the God of our salvation and our true happiness.**

**☩ God, you loved the world so much that you embraced it in all its sin through your beloved Son Jesus Christ, who sought the way of the cross that he might come to Easter and offer us the way back to you. **world, and to consider all that is dull in our hearts. Help us use this time, not only in prayer at worship, but also in the thoughtfulness in which we live our days. Help us also to be aware of others and give us ears that listen, that we may find the words to sustain and the openness to learn through Jesus Christ, our deliverance and our hope. Amen.**

## **First Reading**

Acts 10:9-16

<sup>9</sup> The next day, as they were on their journey and approaching the city, Peter went up on the housetop about the sixth hour to pray. <sup>10</sup> And he became hungry and wanted something to eat, but while they were preparing it, he fell into a trance <sup>11</sup> and saw the heavens opened and something like a great sheet descending, being let down by its four corners upon the earth. <sup>12</sup> In it were all kinds of animals and reptiles and birds of the air. <sup>13</sup> And there came a voice to him: “Rise, Peter; kill and eat.” <sup>14</sup> But Peter said, “By no means, Lord; for I have never eaten anything that is common or unclean.” <sup>15</sup> And the voice came to him again a second time, “What God has made clean, do not call common.” <sup>16</sup> This happened three times, and the thing was taken up at once to heaven.

## **Gospel Reading**

Mark 7:14-23

**P** The Holy Gospel according to St Luke the eighth chapter

**G** **Glory to You, O Lord.**

<sup>14</sup> And he called the people to him again and said to them, “Hear me, all of you, and understand: <sup>15</sup> There is nothing outside a person that by going into him can defile him, but the things that come out of a person are what defile him.” <sup>17</sup> And when he had entered the house and left the people, his disciples asked him about the parable. <sup>18</sup> And he said to them, “Then are you also without understanding? Do you not see that whatever goes into a person from outside cannot defile him, <sup>19</sup> since it enters not his heart but his

stomach, and is expelled?” (Thus he declared all foods clean.)<sup>20</sup> And he said, “What comes out of a person is what defiles him.<sup>21</sup> For from within, out of the heart of man, come evil thoughts, sexual immorality, theft, murder, adultery,<sup>22</sup> coveting, wickedness, deceit, sensuality, envy, slander, pride, foolishness.<sup>23</sup> All these evil things come from within, and they defile a person.”
